The Club offers a shooter a variety of different opportunities to enjoy the shooting sports with several different rifle and pistol ranges, trap shooting, action pistol, muzzle loading, archery, as well as other shooting events throughout the year. Additionally, the Club offers many different training opportunities to enhance your knowledge of a firearm discipline or personal protection, in addition to range and firearm safety through sanctioned NRA courses.

We take range safety very seriously here at the Club. Our very existence as a shooting club depends on everyone shooting safely and following **ALL** of our Safety Rules. It is the responsibility of each and every member to know and practice the rules and regulations set forth by the Club Safety Committee.

It is also the responsibility of each member to protect the Club's integrity by dealing with all unsafe practices and rule infractions immediately upon observation, remembering to always be courteous and diplomatic.

Anyone without a membership card should be considered a non-member and you should ask them to please leave. Our Club's liability insurance will not cover any incident involving a non-member. Of course, if the person in question is in the company of a card carrying member, as that member's guest, then that is okay, as our insurance will allow each member to have one guest with him/her. **NO MEMBER** may give a non-member permission to use a range without that member being present on the range with his/her guest. No Club Officer may circumvent this rule in any way.

A member will be totally responsible for the behavior of his/her guest and will be held directly responsible for any wrongful actions of his/her guest. Your membership card is to be worn in plain sight whenever using a range. Utilize a plastic badge holder or other device to display your card with the "rule of thumb" being that other members should be able to "see" your membership card and identify you as a member.

Membership: A U.S. Citizen having no felony convictions. A membership card will be issued to a citizen 18 years old or older who is willing to follow the Club range safety rules and use firearms in a safe and lawful manor.

First year memberships are \$110.00 (single)/ \$115.00 (family), with yearly dues of \$60 for Single, and \$65 for Family. Volunteer a minimum of 10 hrs during first year of membership.

Services: There are NRA and Club sanctioned shooting matches in High Power Rifle, Small Bore (.22) Rifle and Trap. In addition, there are monthly Muzzle Loading Black Powder matches including knife and tomahawk throwing contests, as well as other special shooting events held throughout the year.

Weekly Small Bore League and Women's Pistol League are offered during the summer months. The practice ranges for rifle and pistol are open to members whenever scheduled competition events are NOT held.

We have 4 trap fields, 100, 50, 25, 15 and 10 yard gun ranges, as well as a 7 yard enclosed pistol range. The club furnishes the wood frames for the attachment of paper targets.

Competition programs are scheduled for 3-D Bow hunting with over 100 3-D targets to choose from when setting up a course of fire out in the woods and valleys that surround three sides of our club.

See the Club's website calendar for a schedule of events; Archery/Bow Hunter, Black Powder, High Power, Smallbore, Trap, Still board, Action Pistol.

Education: The Club has certified NRA counselors, coaches and instructors and offers instruction in Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun, Home Firearm Safety, Personal Protection In the Home, Personal Protection Outside the Home, Muzzle Loading Rifle & Pistol, and Shotgun, as well as, handloading in both shotshell and metallic cartridges. We also offer Range Safety Officer certification. In addition, we offer training to become a NRA Certified Instructor in all of the above disciplines. See below for a brief description of some of the courses offered at the Club.

In the area of Public Safety, we offer a NRA non-firearm program for civic groups called, "REFUSE TO BE A VICTIM", which can be adapted to all age groups.

Additionally, the Club offers a women's only event called Ladies Day, which is an introduction to safe pistol shooting.

For the youth, we have Junior shooting events.

The following are some of the classes available at Fall Creek Valley!

NRA DISCIPLINES AND INSTRUCTION

Home Firearm Safety - This is a 4 hour general introductory and safety class that covers pistols, rifles, and shotguns. There is no live firing in this class.

First Steps Pistol, First Steps Rifle, and First Steps Shotgun - Each of these classes are only 3 hours long and they' cover only the safe operation of one particular firearm, such as a pump shotgun, a .22 cal rifle, or a revolver. There is limited live firing for each class.

Basic Pistol - This is a 10 hour class that covers the safety and operation of both types of pistols, revolvers and semi-automatics. Extensive live fire of both revolvers and semiautomatics is required.

Basic Rifle - This 14 hour class covers the safe handling of all types of rifles from single shot breach loading rifles to semi-automatic magazine fed rifles. Extensive live fire is also required.

Basic Shotgun - This class is 10 hours long, comprising the introduction and safe handling of various types of shotguns. Both shooting sports Trap and Skeet are covered; however, all shooting practice will be from the club's trap fields.

Reloading - This discipline is taught over several weeks and covers metallic reloading and shotshell reloading. Safety is stressed and there is hands-on instruction on several kinds of reloading equipment.

Muzzleloading Pistol, Muzzleloading Rifle & Muzzleloading Shotgun - These three classes run 12 hours each. All three classes use the text from the NRA National Muzzleloading Association. As black powder is extremely dangerous to work with, safety issues are stressed. Live fire is required in all three disciplines.

Personal Protection In the Home - Basic Pistol is prerequisite for this 9 hour class. Legal, moral, and psychological issues are covered along with practice of "in home" shooting scenarios. Extensive live fire required.

Personal Protection Outside the Home - Personal Protection In the Home is a prerequisite for this 14 hour class. The legal issues that come along with discharging a firearm in public are extremely complicated. This class deals in concealed carry and live fire from either a purse or a strong side hip holster at multiple targets. Five hours of range time is required.

Range Safety Officer - This 9 hour class covers how to safely run a range or shooting match. There are also practical exercises dealing with the myriad of situations that can occur on shooting ranges.

FCVCC GENERAL RANGE SAFETY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Safety is your responsibility, not someone else's!!!

October 2018

These rules apply to ALL ranges. A specific range rule will take precedent over a General Range Rule.

1. No shooting before 8:00 AM. Ranges close to casual shooting 30 minutes before sundown daily, unless otherwise specified by a sponsored shooting event.
2. Action Pistol Range is not open to casual shooters and is only to be used during organized/supervised events and approved training classes.
3. **Always** keep the muzzle of the gun pointed in a safe direction. Long guns: muzzle pointed up or down range. Handguns: pointed down or as conditions dictate.
4. **Always** keep the firearm unloaded and the action open until ready to shoot. Load firearms only when on firing line and ready to shoot. (Loaded firearms are allowed off the firing line only if holstered)
5. **Always** keep your finger off the trigger until ready to fire.
6. Never handle another person's firearm without permission.
7. Use of drugs &/or alcohol before and during use of any of the FCVCC ranges is prohibited.
8. Safety rule violations can lead to expulsion from the club.
9. It is against Indiana state law to shoot wildlife on club property.
10. Club members must sign the appropriate range sign-in sheet & pay the range fee before shooting.
11. Club members may bring more than one guest per visit. Members are responsible for each of their guests and their conduct and must supervise them individually while he/she is shooting.
12. Guests:
 - a. must sign the range sign-in sheet & pay range fee.
 - b. must use the same bench as member and take turns shooting.
13. ALWAYS wear your member ID card in plain view.
14. Appropriate eye and ear protection is required at all times.
15. If a designated RSO (Range Safety Officer) is present and in control of the range, you must follow all instructions from the RSO.

Use of alcoholic beverages and controlled drugs is prohibited on Club Property

FCVCC SAFETY RULES AND REGULATIONS

for

Open Rifle and Pistol Range

Safety is your responsibility, not someone else's!!!

In addition to the *General Range Rules*, the following rules will apply **ONLY** to the Open Rifle/Pistol Range.

1. Club members must sign the range sign-in sheet & pay \$1 range fee (Guests pay \$2) before shooting.
2. **RED LIGHTS FLASHING** indicates range is under CEASE-FIRE (range is cold)
3. When a cease-fire is called, all firearms must be unloaded, actions open and up, Chamber flags inserted (if you have one), benched, and shooters standing behind the yellow line.
4. Only cased firearms may be brought to the firing line during cease fire. Cased firearms must stay in case until line is declared hot.
5. No one shall go forward of the firing line for any reason until a complete range cease-fire has been acknowledged by all shooters present and **RED LIGHTS** have been turned on.
6. Never handle uncased firearms or accessories (including magazines and ammo) while **RED LIGHTS** are on or when anyone is down range.
7. Use paper targets only, which are to be attached to the face of the wooden frames provided by the club.
8. Do NOT move 100 yard target frames up to the 50 yard line located in the middle of the 100 yard rifle range.
9. Keep your equipment on one (1) bench that you are using. One member card equals one (1) bench. Use gun racks behind the bench you are using.
10. All firearms should be properly sighted in for safe use on the range. If you are not sure of your sights, check them by shooting from a bench with a rest at 25 or 50 yds. Make sure you are on target.
11. Make sure your bullet hits the proper target and impacts the berm behind the target. If you are not sure where your bullets are going, call for assistance or move to a shorter range to investigate.
12. Never shoot across firing lanes or at an angle to berms. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
13. All shots must be fired from a stationary position. No run & gun shooting!
14. No kneeling to shoot on the 7 and 10 yard ranges.
15. When Shooting prone, place targets low on frame to ensure rounds are hitting berm.
16. Prone position is banned on the 25 yard and shorter ranges.
17. All shots must be aimed and controlled. No rapid firing allowed, at least 1 sec between shots.
18. Do NOT shoot the baffles. They are there to stop random accidental shots from leaving the range. Shooting at the baffles can cost you your membership if caught!
19. Each shooter is responsible for cleaning their area before leaving. Police your brass. Dispose of used targets.

Authorized and Prohibited Guns/Ammo:

1. Full auto or bump fire for any firearm is **NOT** allowed. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
2. 50 cal. BMG ammo / firearms are prohibited
3. Tracer, armor piercing & incendiary ammo are prohibited.
4. No shot shells allowed. We will set up a patterning range in the fall and spring or on request.
5. Shotgun slugs are acceptable.

Enclosed Pistol Range

Safety is your responsibility, not someone else's!!!

In addition to the *General Range Rules*, the following rules apply **ONLY** to the Enclosed Pistol Range.

1. Member must sign the Enclosed Pistol Range sign-in sheet & pay enclosed range fee before shooting. Range fee is \$3.
2. No shooting across firing lanes. **NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
3. All targets must be at eye level. This is critical if you are shooting at a target less than full range length.
4. No chairs or no kneeling to shoot, except handicap members. Those positions increases angle of shot, which may bypass safety barriers/baffles.
5. Drawing and firing from a holster is **NOT** allowed. Start from a low ready position. *Liability concern with too much concrete and someone shooting themselves in the leg or others on the line because of; inexperienced people drawing from a holster or unsafe holster position.*
6. **NO** rapid firing is allowed. Double taps are acceptable. No magazine dumps allowed.
7. Do **NOT** shoot at targets any closer than 3 yds.
8. When the open Rifle/Pistol Range goes cold, the Enclosed Pistol Range is not required to go cold unless wooden door between the two ranges is open.
9. All pistols must be holstered or unloaded and bagged before leaving the range.

Authorized and Prohibited Guns/Ammo

1. Pistols only. No rifles.
2. Max. pistol caliber allowed is .50 cal. Straight wall pistol cartridges only.
3. No high power center fire rifle cartridges
4. No rifles cartridges in any firearms, except “.22 rim fire”.
5. No shotshells or shotgun slugs.

Trap Range

Safety is your responsibility, not someone else's!!!

In addition to the *General Range Rules*, the following rules apply ONLY to the Trap Range.

1. Each member and guest must sign the sign-in sheet & pay the range fee before shooting. \$5 for members, \$6 for non-members.
2. ATA Safety Rules will govern all shooting, both practice and competition, unless otherwise designated by the Trap Committee.
3. Gun may be loaded only when on the firing line. Load one shell only (except for doubles events).
4. Shooter should keep his gun pointed in the general direction of the trap house at all times when on the firing line and refrain from talk or movement that would distract other shooters.
5. Guns shall be kept on open chamber at all times going to and from the trap range, and generally at all times other than when in a shooting position at a trap station. The only exception will be "break-open" guns that may be closed while standing in a gun rack.
6. Shooters must not move from a station with a loaded gun and should remain on the station until the last shooter has fired the final round of that sequence.
7. The Trap Range will be used only under the supervision of a member of the Trap Committee or during Club sponsored shooting activities.
8. An intoxicated person shall be denied shooting privileges.
9. Shoot only from the confines of the concrete trap walks, unless a special event is supervised by the Trap Committee.
10. No picking up of fired hulls from grounds by shooters during a practice or a competitive event or program is allowed.
11. Shotguns or "scatter guns" of 12 gauge or less ONLY will be allowed on the trap range.
12. Only shot shells containing loose shot of 7 ½ size or smaller will be allowed on the trap range.
13. Shooters will be expected to treat "Pullers/Scorers" respectfully and courteously. Shooters should keep in mind that "Pullers/Scorers" are essential to the execution of the sport and that they are dedicated to performing their function to the best of their ability.
14. Using a clear, crisp, pull call gives the shooter the best opportunity to activate a voice release, or to be accurately heard by a Puller, resulting in "on time" targets.
15. Shooters should refrain from mounting the gun until the target of the previous shooter has been either broken or called "lost" or "no target" by the Puller/Scorer.
16. Trap personnel on the field and shooters engaged in shooting are required to wear hearing and eye protection. The ATA/ITA is enabled to enforce this rule.
17. Any problems encountered by the shooter are to be addressed to the Trap Management.
18. Problems cannot be solved by fellow shooters, and they should not be distracted during their shooting experience. Trap personnel will refer the shooter to Trap Management.

Black Powder

Safety is your responsibility, not someone else's!!!

In addition to the *General Range Rules*, the following rules apply **ONLY** to Black Powder.

1. No open cans of powder on the loading bench.
2. No smoking in loading area.
3. Do not load directly from can, flask, or powder horn. Load with separate powder measure only.
4. Cap or prime only on the firing line
5. All loaded cylinders on revolvers should be capped on the firing line.
6. Load black powder rifles and pistols in half cock position, with the frizzin open on flintlocks, and with the hammer down.
7. Carry both rifles and pistols with barrel up and pointed down range to and from the firing line.
8. Popping a cap to clear a rifle or pistol after cleaning is done on the firing line only, with the barrel pointing downrange.
9. Black powder trap can be shot from the 10 yard blocks set in place on the number two trap field during a scheduled match.
10. During a black powder trap shoot, capping or priming is done on the firing line just prior to calling for a target.
11. All National Muzzleloading Rifle Association rules apply.

Archery Ranges

1. Archery practice and 3D ranges are not open to casual shooting and is only to be used during organized /supervised events and approved training classes.
2. Before entering any archery range, attach your ID card to your person in plain sight, sign in on the Archery Range book and pay your range fee; \$8 members, \$10 non-members.
3. The archery 3D range must be shot forwards from target 1 through 30. Never shoot any range in reverse.
4. Field Tip arrows only.
5. No broadheads allowed on any archery range.
6. Crossbows are allowed at shooters discretion.
7. No firearms are to be used on any of the archery ranges or the practice bale (located at the east end of the Trap Range).
8. Use the practice bags adjacent to the clubhouse to set sights. Practice bags will be set out the day of the shoot at the following yardages: 20, 30, 40 and 50 yards.
9. Drugs &/or alcohol before and during use of any of the FCVCC ranges is prohibited.
10. It is against Indiana state law to shoot wildlife on club property.
11. Safety rule violations can lead to expulsion from the club.
12. When the Archery Practice and 3D ranges are open for use, the;
 - a. Enclosed Pistol Range is closed for shooting
 - b. Open Rifle/Pistol Range is open only for Small Bore Rifle shooting events only

Action Pistol Range

Safety is not only the RSO's responsibility, but yours also!!!

In addition to the *General Range Rules*, the following rules apply **ONLY** to the Action Pistol Range.

1. Action Pistol Range is not open to casual shooters and is only to be used during organized/supervised events and approved training classes, which are lead by Authorized Action Pistol Staff. (see list of Authorized Staff at end of these rules.)
2. Each member and guest must sign the Action Pistol Range sign-in sheet & pay \$5 range fee before shooting. Range fee goes to Support the Action Pistol Fund. Special Action Pistol events may require additional range fees.
3. Children age 10 and over may participate if accompanied by a parent or guardian. Youth fee is the same as listed in #2 above.
4. Proper eye and ear protection is to be worn at all times by shooters and spectators, when range is hot.
5. Proper firearm safety is to be observed at all times.
6. Prior to start of an event, a brief safety meeting will be held. **ALL** shooters must be present for the meeting. Late arriving shooters may be allowed to participate at the discretion of the match director.
7. Firearms must remain unloaded and holstered or cased at all times except under the direct supervision of the RSO during the shooter's turn:
 - a. Firearms may be handled at the safe table. **NO AMMUNITION** is to be present while handling at the safe table.
 - b. Magazines, speed loaders and moon clips may be reloaded in the spectator area, but firearms shall not be handled.
8. During Periods of extended daylight during the summer, shooting will cease no later than 8:30 p.m. During periods of shorter daylight, shooting may continue later if lights are available, with shooting ceasing no later than 8:30 p.m. It is at the discretion of the match director to continue or complete a match beyond 8:30 p.m. If lights are not available, shooting will cease no later than 30 minutes before sunset. At the discretion of the match director, shooting may cease earlier if visibility is poor.
9. Other members and guests may use the main firing line and enclosed pistol range while Action Pistol is taking place. However, if the Action Pistol Range is unusable during the normally scheduled time, the match director has the discretion to move Action Pistol to the end of the rifle range and close the main shooting line and enclosed range to other shooters.
10. Brass policy: Do **NOT** pick up brass at the end of your turn (except moon clips). At the end of the night, brass will be divided evenly among those shooters who stay and help to pick it up.
11. Within the boundaries of safe firearm practices, additional rules for the evening may be set by mutual agreement among the participants with RSO approval.
12. The match director has the discretion to modify or add rules as necessary. In case of any disagreement or dispute, the Match Director's Decision Is Final.

FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION ACTION PISTOL

1. Pistols and revolvers in normal handgun calibers excluding 50 cal.
2. Pistol-caliber rifles are not permitted except during special events.
3. Silencers / suppressors are permitted.
4. Shooters are expected to have a sufficient number of magazines or speed loaders. Reloading of magazines or speed loaders and manual loading of revolvers is not permitted while shooting a stage.
5. For non-competitive stages or strings, the shooter may use any capacity magazine. When a competition is being staged, magazine capacity will be decided by mutual consent. If mutual consent cannot be reached, capacity will be decided by the match director.
6. Shooters may bring a firearm to the starting point in a holster, bag, or case. If bagged or cased, the firearm must point downrange while being removed from the bag. *Cross-draw and small-of-back holsters are not permitted.* Any method of holstering, carrying, or drawing that may create a "sweeping" hazard is not permitted.

RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The undersigned person (referred to as "Participant") does intend to engage in marksmanship training or competition referred to as "Activity") which is available with use of the facilities of **FALL CREEK VALLEY CONSERVATION CLUB** (referred to as "Club"). Participant acknowledges that engaging in Activity includes a risk of personal injury or potential death associated with discharging firearms or physical exertion.

In consideration of Club permitting Participant to engage in Activity, and which participation is voluntary and is initiated by Participant, and the price that Club charges for membership and fees associated with Club Activity. Participant agrees to be bound by this Release and Hold Harmless Agreement (referred to as "Release") and agrees:

Participant hereby releases and forever discharges Club and its officers, employees (if any), members including any persons supervising or hosting any Activity, and agents (all of whom shall be referred to hereafter as "Club") from any and all claims arising from or in any way associated with Activity.

Participant understands that this Release includes but is not limited to all claims for injury, death, illness, disease, and damage of any kind to Participant or to Participant's property and arising from any action in a n y way associated with Club including but not limited to the negligence of Club and other Participants using Club property or facilities. In addition, if Participant is in any way injured by any Club Activity, then:

Participant further agrees to hold harmless and defend, reimburse, and indemnify Club from any claims brought by third parties, such as insurance carriers, health care providers, or governmental entities, for reimbursement, or any claim or cause of action of a family member or dependent of Participant, or other damages as a result of or related to participation in Activity.

If Participant is a minor the undersigned parent or guardian does further agree that said minor Participant may as part of any Club Activity possess and discharge firearms including but not limited to rifles, pistols, shotguns, or muzzleloaders.

Participant acknowledges reading this Release agreement before signing it, understanding its terms, and agrees to the tem1s of this Release and agrees that the tem1s of this Release are ongoing and include Participant's future participation in any Club Activity.
